The proposed online capacity building sessions aim to provide insights on how to integrate an intersectional lens in feminist activism and policy around gender mainstreaming.

Intersectional feminism helps us to act on patterns of gendered discrimination in which multiple layers of power inequalities tied to other aspects of people's identities, such as age, gendered expression, color of skin, sexual orientation and location, are continuously reproducing multiple discriminations.

The ultra-conservative political groups connect their backlash on women's rights, especially on the right to bodily autonomy, with an attack on the rights of LGBTQI* communities, among several other intersections.

This current political context visible in countries around the world opens up strategic questions on how LGBTQI* movements and feminists can and should further work together. What are examples of an effective shared strategy, common language? What differences do we need to learn about, especially when working from an intersectional perspective in which other intersections interrelate as well?

An intersectional approach has been introduced in public policy making, among others within the EU policy. Still there is limited knowledge on how public institutions can implement an intersectional gender mainstreaming approach. This starts with the process of data collection that should not only be disaggregated on sex, but also cover other aspects of one's identity and be comparable.

In this session we will discuss examples, dilemma's, challenges: how can we implement a feminist intersectional approach and what are some of the challenges or misconceptions we face?
