

WO=MEN, the Dutch Gender Platform, launches with Vice Versa a Special on Feminist Foreign Policy, available in English



Following the example of other countries, the Dutch Cabinet also wants to push for a feminist foreign policy (FFP)—last November, a letter was published to the Lower House of Parliament on the matter. As such, it wants to reduce inequality and strive for equal positions for men, women, and non-binary people worldwide.

That announcement prompted <u>Vice Versa</u> and <u>WO=MEN</u> to produce a special edition and explore the topic in more depth. What exactly does it mean when governments say they are initiating a feminist foreign policy? The Dutch variant will focus on four Rs: on rights (protecting women's rights), representation (involving women in policy-making and implementation), resources (funds must also benefit women), and a reality check (are there any unexpected negative consequences for women?)—and all four are featured in this issue. PPPs are being portrayed by governments and funders as the new silver bullet for public services and infrastructure projects. DAWN joins a growing critique of PPPs that argues they reinforce the corporate capture of the state and challenges their supposed effectiveness and transparency, finding it problematic that public services risk being taken over by greed and a colonial-era mentality.


