On 22 January, WIDE+ held an extra-ordinary General Assembly to review new membership applications from accross Europe from a diversity of associations and individuals


WIDE+'s formal membership includes now 31 associations in European countries and 32 individual members.

The statement calls on "policymakers on both sides of the Atlantic must honour their human rights, social, climate, and environmental commitments and stop these toxic trade negotiations immediately."

Our House: The Republic of Belarus Shadow Report 2025

Olga Karach, head of the International Center for civil initiatives “Our House” in Belarus - currently operating in exile in Lithuania - has published **The Republic of Belarus Shadow Report 2025**.

The report highlights the systemic and **institutionalized discrimination against women in Belarus**, which include gender-specific repression, state-sanctioned violence, forced labor and societal norms that perpetuate inequality, providing concrete examples of how women are marginalized, degraded, and silenced.

International Feminist Forum on Migration & Displacement organised by WIMN during the AWID Forum in Bangkok, Thailand, in December 2024



On 30 November and 1 December, over 120 participants from around 35 countries participated in the **Feminist Forum on Migration & Displacement (FFMD)**, organised by **Women in Migration Network (WIMN)** - a network that WIDE+ is a part of. The forum was organised ahead of the AWID forum in Bangkok, during which the FFMD released its statement: [Solidarity, Dignity and Equity for Women and Gender Diverse Migrants!](#)

The Forum focused on **reshaping migration policy through feminist principles, challenging systemic injustices like exploitation, violence, racism, and criminalization.**

Organizers stressed the need for "shared analysis and collaboration with feminists across sectors and regions, creating pathways to inclusion, justice, peace, and ecological sustainability while exposing and rejecting false solutions."








The 2024 Critical Trends Report by Feminist Action Nexus focuses on debt, the Bretton Woods Institutions, taxation and climate finance.
